Subject: It is time for complete accounting and documentation

Dear Mr. A. Aziz:

As I write this, I fully expect you to not respond since you already have been ignoring the emails sent by my brothers Rafiq and Iqbal. However, I am doing so to have the matter on record.

My understanding is that you are demanding various documents to settle the matter of my father's investments with you, your brother and one or more of your companies.
